Pursuant to Section 2254.1036 of the Texas Government Code, Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the City of Elmendorf (hereinafter City) will be held on September 17th, 2020 at 7:00 PM at Elmendorf City Hall, 8304 FM 327, Elmendorf, Texas 78112 for the purpose of considering and taking action on all matters on the agenda for the meeting, including approval of an agreement with the law firm of Linebarger Goggan Blair & Sampson, LLP as special counsel to perform all legal services necessary to collect delinquent property taxes and authorizing the execution of such agreement.

The agreement to be considered is necessary for the delinquent taxes owed to the City to be collected in the most effective manner. The City desires that such delinquent tax, penalties and interest be collected as provided in the Texas Tax Code.

The Linebarger Goggan Blair & Sampson, LLP firm is fully qualified to provide this representation, being the largest delinquent tax collection law firm in the State of Texas, as well as the United States and having been engaged in this specialized legal service for more than 40 years.
